relative from incarceration or far worse Hitler's own signature can be found on many of these exemption orders But as the war dragged on Nazi politics came to trump military logic even in the face of the Wehrmacht's growing manpower needs closing legal loopholes and making it virtually impossible for these soldiers to escape the fate of millions of other victims of the Third Reich Based on a deep and wide ranging research in archival and secondary sources as well as extensive interviews with more than four hundred Mischlinge and their relatives Rigg's study breaks truly new ground in a crowded field and shows from yet another angle the extremely flawed dishonest demeaning and tragic essence of Hitler's rule
