This is a brief guide to American Psychological Association (APA) and Modern Language Association (MLA) rules, tailored to academic writing. Examples in this guide are accurate according to the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association*, 7th edition (2020) and the *MLA Handbook* (2020). Both new APA and MLA rules contain changes and additions not found in previous editions.

What is APA style?

- APA style does not refer to a writing style; rather, it is the enhanced intellectual standards of the American Psychological Association (APA) that are used in the books and journals of publication. Other social and behavioral sciences have also adopted APA style for their own writing needs.
- **Editorial-style** refers to the rules and guidelines a publisher uses to ensure consistent presentation of written material.

Writing for the Behavioral Sciences

Guidelines for the Behavioral Sciences

- In the responsibility of researchers to give credit where due to their sources at every point in the publication process, even after publication.
- Authors should keep their data for at least three years after the publication date if requested by their program.
- Publishers are expected that researchers will give proper credit for their research and not present the work of others as their own.
 - **Self-plagiarism:** Researchers should not present their own publications as new publications.
- **Conflict of interest:** It is expected that researchers will note any conflicts of interest that could appear to compromise a conduct of research; areas of the research doesn't determine they exist.
- It is best to note any activities or relationships that could appear to compromise a conduct of research; areas of the research doesn't determine they exist.

Manuscript Structure & Content

Academic Article Requirements: Standard

Reporting standards are not based on logical form; rather, they are based on research designs and interpretations of the actual study.

References:

1. **Sectional:** Only include the necessary heading indicated. The publications should be no longer than 50 characters.
 - A. For a student paper: One section is required.
 - B. For all other references: One section is required.
2. **Page numbers:** Include at the top of each page on the cover page and the following pages, right margin.
3. **Title:**
4. **Author's names:** on name of each author.
5. **One sentence affiliation:** of each author.
 - A. For a student paper: Include the name, name and number, institution name, and class date.
6. **Authors listed:** that requested the student paper.
 - A. When a paragraph: Complete developmental affiliation, include the C.R.C. ID of individual.
 - B. C.R.C. Boxes: Department of Psychology, 5th floor, University.
 - C. Standard paragraphs: Affiliation changes (if any).
 - D. Standard paragraphs: Acknowledgements (e.g., grants, financial supports, and thanks). Be consistent with the manuscript and original research paper. (e.g., stated in a paragraph by publication request or due to the author's and committee of interest.)
 - E. Standard paragraphs: Contact information. Include your complete mailing address and would address with no spaces at the end of the mailing address.
 - F. C.R.C. Boxes: indicating the author should be addressed to Robert T. Schlesier, Department of Engineering, 5th floor, University, Yonkers, NY 10551. Email: rtshlesier@state.edu

7. **Abstract:** An brief, concise summary of the article's content. Must appear on student paper.
8. **Keywords:** A list of significant words that appear in the manuscript. The list should begin with keywords in italic type, followed by a list of words requested by committee in regular type. Should appear on student paper.
9. **Introduction:** A description of the specific problem and the author's research strategy.
10. **Method:** A description of how the study was conducted.
11. **Results:** A summary of the data collected and the subsequent analysis.
12. **Discussion:** An analysis of the implications and meaning of the research results. That also draws upon other cited sources.
13. **Missing or incomplete (if applicable):**
14. **Minor modifications:** A concise synthesis of the research.
15. **Footnotes:**
 - A. Standard footnotes supplementing logically significant information.
 - B. Copyright permission: the author acknowledge the source of being the original author and their name, figure, and tables that have been reprinted or adapted.

Writing Clearly & Concisely

Headings

- Headings should have:
 - The parts of your paper work together.
 - Your paper is organized logically from your own logically important and how much you relate to the others.
- APA uses five heading formats:
 - **Sectional:** **Sectional, 5th fl., Title Case Headings**
 - **Sectional, 5th fl., Title Case Headings**
 - **Sectional, 5th fl., Title Case Headings, Italicized Title, a Period.**

Characterizing Headings

- The next table is heading for the manuscript page of your paper.
- Use the same heading level for figures and visual materials.
- Use the next heading to follow all of your headings in some sort of. Do not start your paper with multiple levels of heading.
- Do not start headings with numbers or letters, or punctuation.

Characterizing Headings: 1st Paragraph

- Use the appropriate level of specificity.
- **1st:** Using the word more to suggest specificity is not an accurate way of using the phrase "appropriate level".

- Differentiated and integrated should be done with only one or two levels.
- The sentence is listed.
- Use the singular or they. Not a group because most they are their processes.
- Avoid using adjectives to names the listed people (e.g., the girl, the group).
- Use plural when they call themselves.
- From first language (e.g., in person with pronouns), identity-first language (e.g., with names of persons or both may be acceptable).

Characterizing Headings: 2nd Paragraph

- Use parallel designations for groups (e.g., compare gay individuals, straight men, gay men, and gay people).
- When referring to multiple social groups, don't just switch to either off social dimensions by default (e.g., men and women, white Americans and mixed minorities).

Characterizing Headings: 3rd Paragraph

- Consider "Otherwise," either for a person's role, and then it's assigned role.
- Use the singular they for individuals whose identities are not known.
- Do not use terms that might broaden (e.g., opposite gender).
- Standard verb tenses: A pattern of interaction, behavior, identity, and social context—different from normal processes.
