Katherine agrees to marry Petruchio after seeing that he is the only man willing to counter her quick remarks; however at the ceremony Petruchio makes an embarrassing scene when he strikes the priest and drinks the communion wine. After the wedding Petruchio takes Katherine to his home against her will. Once they are gone Gremio and Tranio disguised as Lucentio formally bid for Bianca with Tranio easily outbidding Gremio. However in his zeal to win he promises much more than Lucentio actually possesses. When Baptista determines that once Lucentio's father confirms the dowry Bianca and Tranio i.e. Lucentio can marry, Tranio decides that they will need someone to pretend to be Vincentio Lucentio's father. Meanwhile Tranio persuades Hortensio that Bianca is not worthy of his attentions thus removing Lucentio's remaining rival.
