Students will begin class with solving the problem of the day with the general education teacher Mrs. Louk (Special education teacher assists students D, L, and M during beginning of class) 2. Questions Students will be given the opportunity to ask any questions they may have about division before we split into stations. 3. Split students into 4 groups to prepare for stations: Give students a record sheet; go over each station before students move.
