regulations and the Guidelines contain both scoping and technical criteria Therefore in using any of the ANSI standards it is necessary to also consult the Act HUD s regulations and the Guidelines for the scoping requirements Providing an environment where persons with disabilities can have the same access to and ability to use housing that persons without disabilities enjoy is both a worthwhile goal and the law The Department is committed to helping those who develop housing to meet the requirements of the law so that we can reach the goal of providing meaningful access for people with disabilities
