EKG Anatomy



P Wave - atrial depolarization activity in the lower right atrium
QRS Complex - ventricular depolarization activity in the lower left ventricle
T Wave - ventricular repolarization activity in the lower left ventricle
ST Segment - the segment between the QRS complex and the T wave, representing the time between ventricular depolarization and repolarization

ECG Rhythms

- Ventricular Fibrillation** - Irregular, chaotic, and disorganized electrical activity. No discernible P waves, QRS complexes, or T waves.
- Ventricular Tachycardia** - Rapid, regular, and narrow QRS complex. No discernible P waves. Rate is 100-180 bpm.
- Supraventricular Tachycardia** - Rapid, regular, and narrow QRS complex. No discernible P waves. Rate is 100-180 bpm.
- Atrial Fibrillation** - Irregular, chaotic, and disorganized electrical activity. No discernible P waves, QRS complexes, or T waves.
- Sinus Bradycardia** - Slow, regular, and narrow QRS complex. Rate is 60 bpm or slower.
- 1st Degree AV Block** - Slow, regular, and narrow QRS complex. P waves are present, but the interval between P waves and QRS complexes is prolonged.
- 2nd Degree Block Type I - Wenckebach** - Slow, regular, and narrow QRS complex. P waves are present, but the interval between P waves and QRS complexes is prolonged and irregular.
- 2nd Degree Block Type II - Mobitz** - Slow, regular, and narrow QRS complex. P waves are present, but the interval between P waves and QRS complexes is prolonged and irregular.
- 3rd Degree Block** - Slow, regular, and narrow QRS complex. P waves are present, but the interval between P waves and QRS complexes is prolonged and irregular.
- Sinus Tachycardia** - Fast, regular, and narrow QRS complex. Rate is 100-180 bpm.
- Supraventricular Tachycardia** - Fast, regular, and narrow QRS complex. Rate is 100-180 bpm.
- Paroxysmal Supraventricular Tachycardia** - Fast, regular, and narrow QRS complex. Rate is 100-180 bpm.
- Polymorphic Ventricular Tachycardia** - Fast, irregular, and wide QRS complex. Rate is 100-180 bpm.
- Torsades de Pointes** - Fast, irregular, and wide QRS complex. Rate is 100-180 bpm.



Electrical Therapy Basics



- Defibrillation** - Used to treat ventricular fibrillation (VF) and pulseless ventricular tachycardia (VT).
- Synchronized Cardioversion** - Used to treat atrial fibrillation (AF), atrial flutter (AFL), and supraventricular tachycardia (SVT).
- Transcutaneous Pacing** - Used to treat bradycardia and asystole.

Airway Management



- Advanced** - Endotracheal intubation (ETI) - Use for patients with severe respiratory distress or who are unable to breathe on their own.
- Basic** - Bag-valve-mask (BVM) ventilation - Use for patients who are unable to breathe on their own.
- Advanced Airway** - Laryngeal mask airway (LMA) - Use for patients who are unable to breathe on their own.
- Basic Airway** - Oral airway - Use for patients who are unable to breathe on their own.

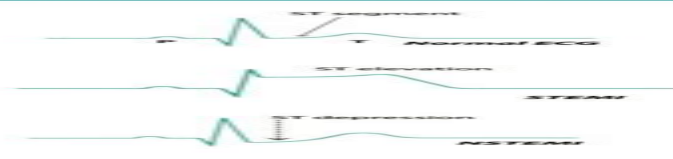
Post-Resuscitation Care



- Follow the ABCs** - Airway, Breathing, Circulation, Disability, Exposure.
- Monitoring** - Continuous monitoring of vital signs and oxygen saturation.
- Temperature** - Maintain body temperature between 36°C and 38°C.
- Fluids** - Administer fluids as needed to maintain blood pressure and perfusion.
- Medications** - Administer medications as needed to manage pain, anxiety, and other symptoms.

Acute Coronary Syndromes (ACS)

- Unstable Angina** - Chest pain that is not relieved by rest or nitroglycerin.
- ST Segment Elevation MI (STEMI)** - Chest pain that is relieved by nitroglycerin and is associated with ST segment elevation on the ECG.
- Non-ST Segment Elevation MI (NSTEMI)** - Chest pain that is not relieved by rest or nitroglycerin and is associated with ST segment depression or T wave inversion on the ECG.



Stroke Assessment and Treatment

- Stroke Assessment** - Use the Cincinnati Prehospital Stroke Scale (CPSS) to assess for stroke.
- Stroke Treatment** - Administer aspirin and tPA as indicated.
- Stroke Prevention** - Administer aspirin and statins as indicated.

Code Termination

- Consult with medical control before code termination.**
- Document the code termination.**
- Provide post-resuscitation care.**
