

Montessori for Toddlers Maria Graham,2020-04-21 Do you want to learn home Montessori activities to do with your child If yes then keep reading When you think about school you are probably thinking about the elementary school years you spent sitting at your desk and listening to your teacher most of the day While this school method is still the most popular to date another lesser known school method is becoming increasingly popular among parents and educators The Montessori school method has become very popular in recent years However this type of school uses a method very different from the conservative one and its application is therefore still somewhat controversial Dr Maria Montessori was a professor of anthropology in Rome in the early twentieth century Maria Montessori was heavily influenced by Friedrich Froebel who invented the nursery school and Johann Henrich Pestalozzi and firmly believed that children learned through activities He invented a new philosophy on raising children Maria Montessori s philosophy and methodology teach that children learn

more in a stimulating environment According to her philosophy a teacher is more of a keeper of the environment and helps to create one that facilitates the self guided learning process for children Today many teachers and parents strongly follow this type of education as evidenced by the growing number of Montessori schools in the world What are the differences between Montessori schools and traditional schools In traditional classrooms children with children of the same age are grouped together and follow exactly the same lessons participate in the same activities and work Montessori classrooms are very different Typically a Montessori classroom is designed for children of different ages and follows an open concept style with different work areas Lessons are generally held in small groups of children while other children work or study alone This concept allows children to expand their individual and social development In a traditional school the teacher acts as the one who provides all the information offered by the school and mainly uses books and a rigorous methodology In a Montessori school the teacher acts as a guide and often mixes conventional teaching aids but also other materials such as stories and objects In Montessori schools students often take responsibility for planning their work and time Montessori students strong artists While many parents firmly believe in the Montessori method this school method is still quite unknown and often controversial However it has been shown by psychologists in the United States that the children of the Montessori schools not only received an excellent education but in some areas even exceeded the children who attended traditional schools Furthermore students attending Montessori schools seemed to outperform others when it came to social skills and behaviors This book covers the following topics Who was Montessori Creating the right environment Organizing the spaces at home Practical activities Sensorial activities Language activities Self discovering Conflict resolution temper tantrum Montessori parenting habit Socialization How to unleash the child's creative potential And much more So what are you waiting for Learn more about Montessori method now *Approaches to Early Childhood and Elementary Education* Francis Wardle, 2009 This book covers a vast range of different philosophical and practical approaches to early education from Free Open schools and Waldorf education to the Core Curriculum and the learning standards approach of the U S federal No Child Left Behind Act By the early years it is meant the ages from infancy through the end of elementary school While some of the approaches such as Montessori and Reggio Emilia are best known for the pre school years and the standards approach is best known for American K 12 education there is more and more overlap and merging across early childhood and elementary education approaches world wide All the approaches covered in this text can be seen in programs from infancy through the end of elementary school even if each may focus on a certain age within this time frame We are seeing major changes in infant pre kindergarten and elementary school education approaches world wide These changes are the result of several major factors including the extensive and powerful new brain research globalisation of markets ideas and the Internet rapid demographic shifts in many developed countries and a move to more universal education in developing countries and more universal pre school programs in developed countries Thus the focus of this book in describing a variety of current education approaches

with a detailed description of their historical and philosophical foundations and their current practice is very timely
