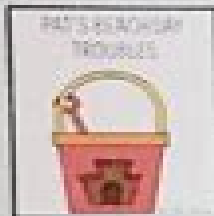

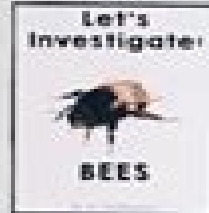
Fiction
