


Have the students write and illustrate a page each day they learn about a new animal. The students can also color, cut, and create their very own paper bag puppets: a kangaroo, a panda, a fox, or a rhino. We include a mini storybook about mammals that the students can read themselves. Then have them make an art figure of their favorite animal with legs that actually move. They can choose from a camel, an elephant, a lion, a coyote, and many others. There are flip booklets to teach which animals are mammals, birds, or reptiles. Other amazing animal activities include a paper plate tortoise, a lion number line, animal bookmarks, word search, and favorite animal graph. We also include picture and vocabulary flash cards, certificates, and much more.
