Today the usage of foreign media is normal for us and exchange does not stop at national borders. We feel that our need to communicate in general becomes greater and greater. Hence we have to become sensitive to other people's cultural and communicative specifics in order to enjoy the international exchange and to understand the other person in the right way. That means that we have to learn about intercultural interethnic communication. Three complex building blocks in understanding intercultural communication can be defined and will be analysed in the first chapter communication culture and context. As communication and culture are interrelated and as they both interact with context we first need to look at the former two. Context then serves as the necessary background against which intercultural communication can be understood. The development of an understanding of intercultural communication will lead to an overview of problems in interethnic conversations such as misunderstandings stereotypes and prejudices. Intercultural communication apprehension and fossilization. This then serves as a basis for outlining methods of how miscommunication can be solved.
